Mihinare Character Alignment

Demonstrates respect for and willingness to participate in the Mihinare character of the school (e.g., Chapel services, Karakia, and religious education) and the principles of Te Oranga Ake.

Upholds the values of manaakitanga, whanaungatanga, and aroha.

Displays pride in her identity as a Māori kōhine and contributes positively to the cultural and spiritual life of the kura.

Academic Achievement

Shows evidence of consistent effort and achievement across the curriculum.

Strives for personal excellence and is committed to academic improvement.

Demonstrates a strong work ethic and willingness to seek support when needed.

Attendance

Maintains regular attendance (85%+).

Provides valid reasons and communication for any absences.

Participation

Actively involved in kura life, including sports, kapa haka, leadership, service and/or community events.

Willing to represent the kura with pride in both internal and external events.

Behaviour & Attitude

Consistently respectful and co-operative with kaiako, peers, and staff.
